Integrated Trauma Informed Care and Co-Occurring Disorder Treatment

(This training is required for the Capable-Level of the Co-Occurring Certification Program)

Course Description:

As Integrated Behavioral Health professionals we are faced with the impact of trauma on those we treat every day. The impact of trauma can be both triggering and stressful for the clinicians providing care, and current brain research can lead us to potentially more optimistic and pragmatic interventions, starting with an increase in our own self-care! We will incorporate discussion, lecture, video and interactions.

Learning Objectives

Participants will be able to:

- Define Complex Trauma as the interconnectedness between exposure to certain forms of traumatic experiences, including familial, historical, and racial trauma, and the multifaceted and evolving consequences of these experiences.
- Recognize the emotional and physiological impact of psychological maltreatment, including long term epigenetic shifts over generations and resiliency evident over time.
- Complete trauma-connected assessments such as ACE's, Resilience Scale, and Professional Quality of Life Scale.
- Explore Top-Down and Bottom-Up approaches to healing
- Differentiate between Secondary trauma, vicarious trauma, and compassion fatigue.
